Message from the CEO



Dear friends, partners, and families of MVH & NDHH -

In many ways, 2019 challenged the MVH team to recommit to our Mission & Vision: to enhance the lives of those we serve by supporting what matters most to them & to be everyone's first thought for those in need of comfort, compassion, dignity, & quality of life.

The MVH team persevered to provide the highest quality compassionate care despite staffing shortages, fluctuating patient census, alterations in the federal reimbursement model, & increasingly stringent regulations. Even with these unpredictable changes in the Hospice landscape, MVH accomplished an astonishing number of projects in 2019, ending the year with more to celebrate than regret. Clearly, the MVH Values provided the guidepost for our

staff & Volunteers: T.I.E.S. that bind us together – Teamwork, Integrity/Accountability, Empathy, & Service.

In the first quarter of 2019, Volunteer Services & Community Outreach Manager Kelly Montanye relaunched the MVH Volunteer program, incorporating rolling, flexible orientation to accommodate the busy schedules of students, the workforce, & retirees. She also brought us up to compliance with our documentation & required regulatory tracking. We ended 2019 with a talented group of 33 Volunteers & exceeded the federal requirement that we replace 5% of patient care staffed hours with Volunteers. Kelly's amazing work was acknowledged by the Fulton Montgomery Chamber of Commerce as Young Business Professional of the year.

Also during the first three months of the year, the MVH Foundation Board kicked off a "Burn the Mortgage" campaign, raising over \$200,000 in donations & pledges toward our goal of \$300,000. It was a perfect opportunity for Foundation Board members to reconnect with donors who supported the creation of the Nancy Dowd Hospice Home back in 2005.

At the beginning of the year, we transitioned to a new electronic health system Suncoast for patient documentation. The MVH team worked diligently throughout 2019 to learn the ins and outs of the system, optimize additional modules for efficiency & regulatory compliance, & work through the expected bugs & growing pains. There was a significant learning curve, but we are better organization for it.

In the second quarter of 2019, we launched a Speakers Bureau to educate the community & healthcare providers on Hospice care & debunk the many myths in circulation. From financial planning to grief counselling to determining the "right" time to call us for help, our team of experts made a concerted effort to have a presence in each of the four counties MVH serves: Fulton, Montgomery, Saratoga, & Hamilton. We also drew a nice media presence as a result of our awareness campaign.

In the spring of 2019, we hosted a Pet Therapy training class, thanks to the generosity of St. Mary's Healthcare & CDPHP. Six dogs & trainers graduated with a dual certification in AKC Good Citizen & Therapy Dogs International, both recognized across the country in a variety of volunteer settings.

At the annual staff recognition event in May, MVH celebrated the 20-year anniversary of our most tenured employee Robin Jusenius, RN. MVH founder Nancy Dowd hired Robin, who is beloved by families across our service area.

We were honored in the last part of the year to receive a \$20,000 grant from the Johnstown Hospital Foundation to pursue a new service line in Palliative Care. Palliative Care is a model that focuses on

patients with complex, chronic ailments who do not have the six-month-or-less prognosis required by Hospice. Palliative Care aims to keep patients out of the hospital & emergency room, while supporting their personal goals. Our region has a significant need for this service. MVH is excited to begin this work & become the preferred provider for the Mohawk Valley.

In addition to receiving the grant, MVH hosted a full-day community workshop on Palliative Care at the Holiday Inn Johnstown. Sponsored by Fulton County Office for the Aging, MVH brought in national keynote speaker Lori Bishop, MHA, BSN, RN, CHPN, Vice President of Palliative & Advanced Care at the National Hospice & Palliative Care Organization (NHPCO). An afternoon speaking panel included Dr. Sheridan from St. Mary's Healthcare & Nurse Practitioner Sue Casler from the Stratton V.A. in Albany. More than 40 participants from the community attended the event.

In the fall of 2019, we also celebrated the 2nd Annual Nancy J. Dowd Humanitarian Award in our 31st year of business, recognizing a lifetime's worth of community service by Jack Scott. Recently retired from local radio station WENT, Jack continues to serve on both the MVH Board of Directors, as well as the MVH Foundation Board.

As you can see, 2019 was a year to be proud of in many ways, despite our struggle to sustain our nonprofit organization in a fragile healthcare environment wrought with uncertainty. If you haven't visited recently, I encourage you to contact us for a tour & cup of coffee. If you haven't donated in awhile, we rely on & appreciate the support.

FOUNDATION HIGHLIGHT

The community came together in 2004 for MVH and raised an astonishing \$2.5M that was needed to pair with a construction loan to build our Nancy Dowd Hospice Home and finance the land on which it sits. In 2019, the MVH Foundation raised \$200K in pledges to help "Burn the Mortgage" on the \$300K loan balance. Eliminating the financial burden of the mortgage allows us to spend more money on the care of hospice patients and families. Thank you to everyone who generously donated to the campaign!

Patient Care Highlights or By The Numbers







We have celebrated 31 Years of delivering compassionate care with dignity.

We provided compassionate care to 233 patients and their families.

Over **73%** of our patients were able to peacefully pass at their homes.

MVH provided 48 days of respite care at the NDHH. This service is ideal for caregivers who have to be out of town or have an obligation that conflicts with round-the-clock care. Current state and federal law prohibit Hospices from billing for these "Respite Stays," which essentially results in charity care at \$300 per day or \$1,500 each week.

18% percent of MVH patients were under the age of 64.

On average, MVH supported 25 patients daily throughout the four-county region.

PATIENTS SERVED BY LOCATION


- 73.1% of patients served at home

BEREAVEMENT SERVICES

Grief support services and bereavement counseling sessions are provided free of charge, regardless of whether an individual has a connection to MVH.



391 visits provided by our Chaplain to patients & family members for spiritual support. Like all our services, chaplaincy is optional. You do not have to have any spiritual or religious support unless you choose to.

VOLUNTEER SERVICES

Mountain Valley Hospice relies upon the generous commitment of time and talent from Volunteers to fulfill our mission.

33 volunteers donated over 1,350 hours of their time in 2019 which generated

a cost savings of \$23,038 to the organization.

182 massages were given to 61 patients while on Hospice Care


